




- **Expanding our JA Company Program** to 30 South Florida classrooms. - **Overcoming various obstacles**, students from North Gardens High School, an alternative school for at-risk students, secured second place in Junior Achievement's 2nd Annual National Stock Market Challenge, highlighting the value of JA programs for at-risk youth.
- **Pioneering a Student Managed Investment Fund** pilot program for high school students. This unique program allows high school students to research, analyze, and recommend real stocks for Junior Achievement's investment portfolio, exemplifying our dedication to expanding educational horizons.

As we build upon past triumphs, we remain dedicated to Junior Achievement's mission of inspiring and preparing young people for success. 

Single-day learning experiences for children in grades K-5, delivered by caring volunteers from Miami's corporate community.




JA Take Stock in Your Future & Stock Market Challenge

The Junior Achievement Stock Market Challenge, featuring JA Take Stock in Your Future, provides students an opportunity to test their investing savviness through six in-class lessons and a realistic stock market simulation. During the competition, every 60 seconds represents one trading day. Teams have \$1,000,000 and 60 "days" to trade. The team with the highest net worth in its stock portfolio at the closing bell wins!

BOUNDLESS POTENTIAL



After placing second in our local stock market competition back in October, a class of students from North Gardens High School, an alternative school, had a team place second in Junior Achievement's 2nd Annual *National* Stock Market Challenge. Even with last-minute team changes, these students once again earned second place at the national virtual competition, where they competed against nearly 20 other student teams from across the country.

This win is especially impactful because North Gardens is a high school for at-risk youth: most of whom have struggled in the traditional education system, and many of whom are neurodiverse and whose learning styles are not well-served by conventional high schools. For some, this may be their last chance to earn a standard high school diploma. These students have thrived through their participation in JA programs.




