Dear JA Friends & Supporters,

The 2020-2021 school year was a school year unlike any other, with many students learning from home, school, or a combination of the two. The coronavirus pandemic continued to present various challenges, resulting in continued uncertainty and the emergence of a "new normal." Junior Achievement faced these obstacles head on, and with the help of our corporate partners, educators, volunteers, and board members, we humbly served over 33,000 South Florida children with virtual programs designed to inspire and prepare young people to succeed in a global economy.

Junior Achievement of Greater Miami begins each year with the intention of not only meeting our goals but exceeding them. We are proud to announce the following accomplishments, achieved during the 2020-2021 school year:

- Pivoted all programs to be delivered **virtually**
- **Increased average Instructional Contact Hours (ICH) from 6 hours per student to nearly 10 hours per student**, for a total of 331,438 Instructional Contact Hours; this translates to **increased depth of impact and learning gains for students**
- Successfully delivered the **JA Inspire program to 10,736 students**, which is 79% more than the initial projection of 6,000 students
- Raised a **record amount of funds through the 28th Annual Junior Achievement Golf & Tennis Invitational**: enough to provide JA programs to over 10,000 students
- Represented by a team of high school students from Miami Beach Senior High at the **Inaugural National JA Stock Market Challenge; our team of students took home first place** in the national competition where eight JA areas were represented by 23 student teams
- Recognized by Miami-Dade County Public Schools as the **"Exemplary Dade Partner Winner"** for the 2020-2021 school year

The most amazing thing about these achievements is they were all accomplished with only 8 staff members, and more importantly, through the passion and enthusiasm of over 1,200 volunteers from the business and education world. Our special thanks to all the volunteers, educators, financial supporters, and staff who made 2020-2021 the most memorable and successful school year in JA's history. 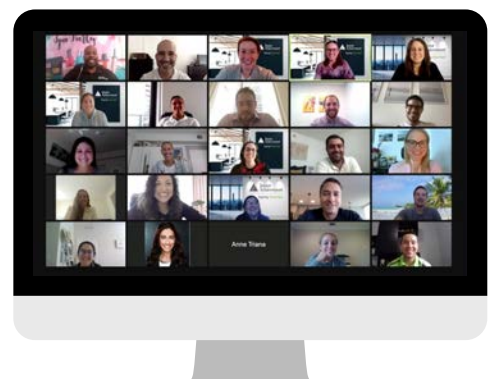

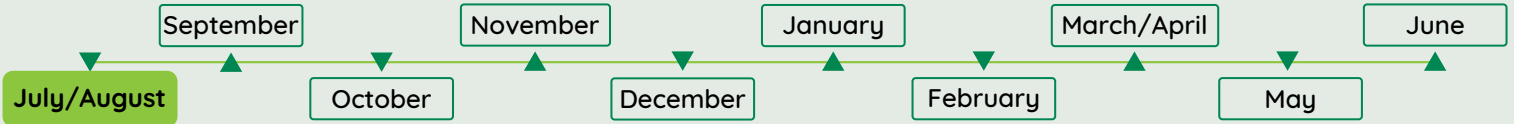

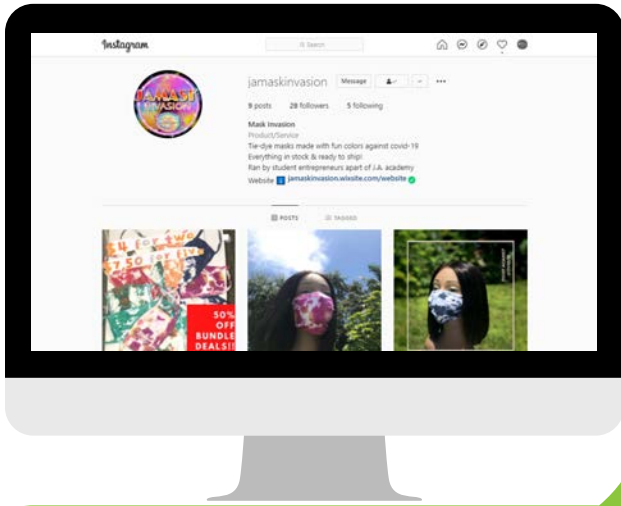

## JULY/AUGUST 2020 | JA Company Program



During the months of July and August 2020, Junior Achievement of Greater Miami hired eleven student interns from Miami-Dade County Public Schools. One of their tasks was to assist us in taking the JA Company Program completely virtual, by participating in it themselves. Volunteers from our Young Professionals Board guided students through the life cycle of a business, from launch to liquidation.

Working as a cohesive team, students launched "JA Mask Invasion". For their product, the students decided to sell tie-dyed facial coverings. The students created a website on Wix to sell their product. They marketed their product by advertising on various social media platforms. After liquidating the company, the students were able to split up the profits from the company and earn their final paychecks!

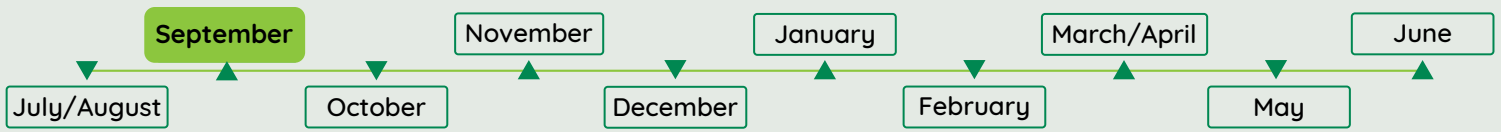

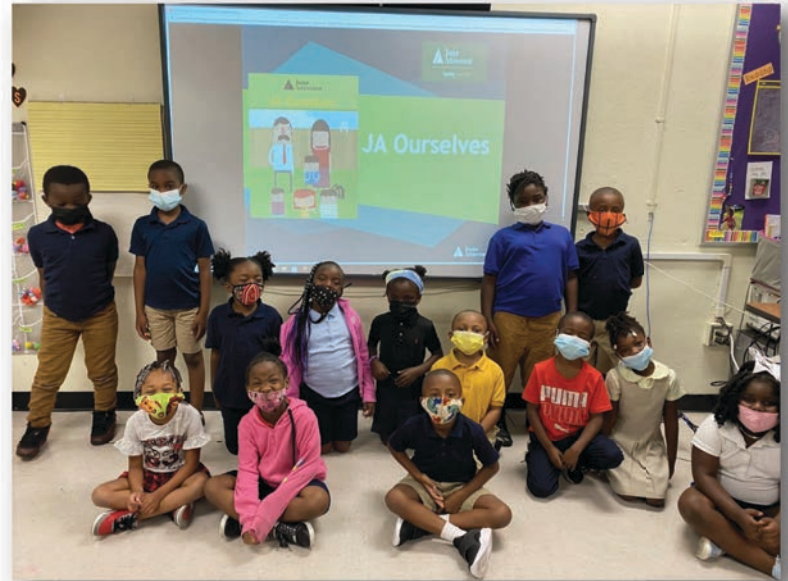
# SEPTEMBER 2020 | JA in a Day

# NOVEMBER/ DECEMBER 2020 | Latin Code Week

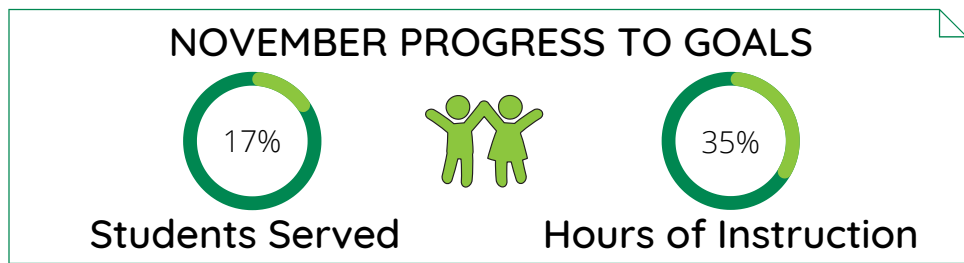
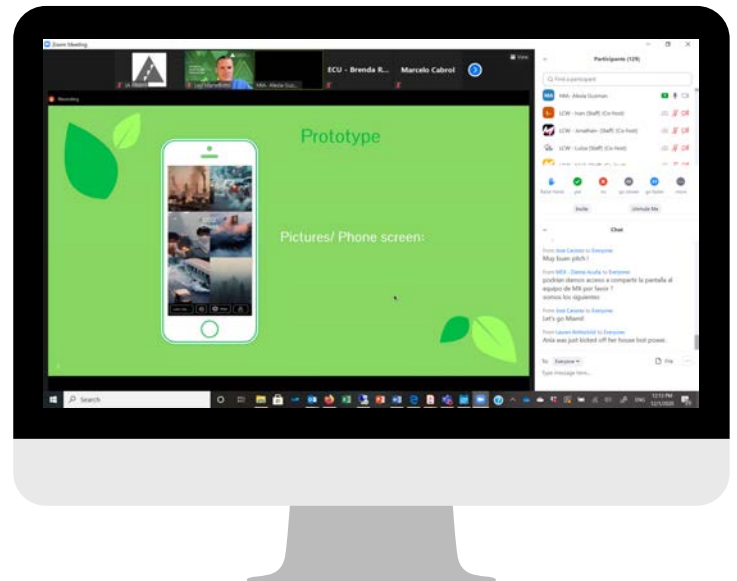


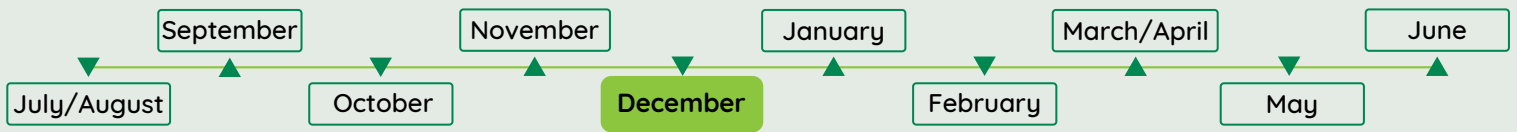
During the fall semester, **57 students** from Cutler Bay Senior High were a part of the first cohort of students from the United States to participate in JA's Latin Code Week (LCW).

The Latin Code Week program is sponsored by SAP to help guide students towards careers in the STEM field. Our students were split into 9 different teams and under the guidance of volunteers from SAP, the students were tasked with creating a mobile app to thwart climate change. SAP volunteers taught the students how to use the Build App and led them through creating a presentation. The students then competed against other teams from various Latin American countries. The students gained invaluable knowledge that will assist them as they progress through high school.

Created from a partnership between Junior Achievement and SAP, the **Latin Code Week** Program has influenced thousands of youth to consider STEM careers and prepare to become the workforce of the future.

In 2020, 11 Latin American countries took advantage of this STEM-based program to expose young people to a range of skillsets, including coding using SAP Build, developing the mindset of an entrepreneur, and strengthening soft skills. Collectively, the program impacted nearly 6,000 young people in Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Perú, Ecuador, México, USA (Miami), Puerto Rico, and Venezuela.





# DECEMBER 2020 | JA Inspire (kickoff)

The JA Inspire program kicked-off on December 8, 2020 with great success! This unique career exploration program provides 8th grade students with a full 13 hours of personalized instruction. **Because of JA Inspire, we surpassed our annual goal of delivering 188,455 Instructional Contact Hours (ICH) before the end of the fall semester!** Over 10,000 middle school students benefitted from the JA Inspire curriculum and program supplements, which include planning and budgeting tools designed to assist students on their path to graduate and achieve career satisfaction. Students had access to the virtual JA Inspire Career Expo through the end of the school year. We are very grateful to the **Frederick A. Deluca Foundation** for their support as we developed and launched this program!



**JA Inspire** is a groundbreaking career exploration program designed for students in 8th grade and consists of three segments: 1) five in-class sessions; 2) JA Inspire Career Expo, and; 3) a post-Career Expo debrief. JA Inspire forges a critical link between school and the workplace, opening students' minds to what is possible and the steps they will need to take to achieve success in the future. This program can be delivered in a virtual learning environment.

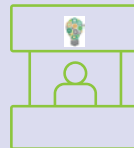

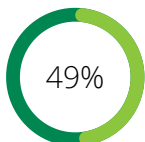

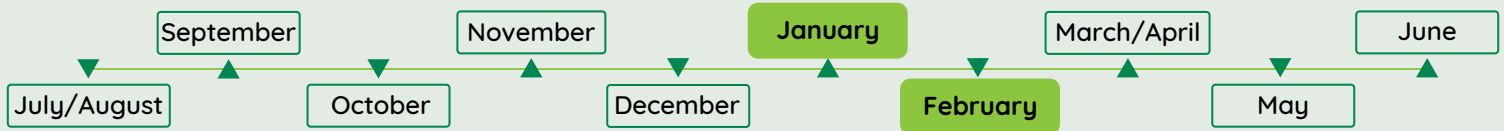

Success starts with savings. **Future Bound Miami** is dedicated to giving children an opportunity to have their own Children's Savings Account (CSA), so they can start saving early. Junior Achievement participated in this groundbreaking initiative by providing our programs, delivered by dedicated Junior Achievement volunteers, to all student participants. The kindergarten curriculum, called JA Ourselves, focuses on earning, saving, and spending, and introduces students to the fundamental concept of "needs vs. wants". During the 2020-2021 school year, JA volunteers delivered financial literacy learning experiences to 6,095 elementary school students through the Future Bound CSA initiative.
