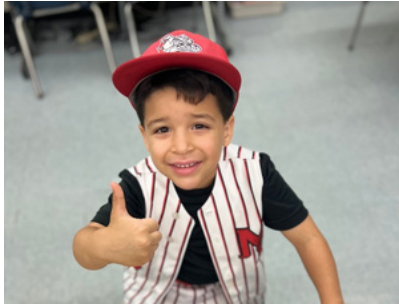

WHAT WE DO

We teach young people about money — how to earn it, save it, spend it, and share it — while preparing them to succeed in school, work, and life.

Why? We want to break the cycle of poverty in Miami.

We can change their path, and change their life, with small inputs at formative moments. We know that small changes in direction lead to big impact over time, so we work directly with K-12 students. We partner with Miami-Dade County Public Schools as well as schools in Monroe County, prioritizing under-resourced schools.

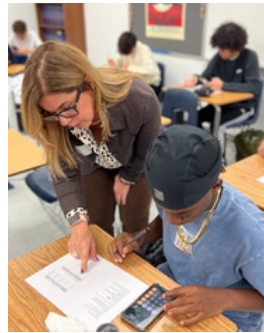

Since 1957, Junior Achievement of Greater Miami has partnered with Miami-Dade County Public Schools (M-DCPS) to bring life-changing financial literacy, workforce readiness, and entrepreneurship programs to students across the district.

M-DCPS is the third-largest school district in the nation, with more than 330,000 students this year—over half of whom come from economically disadvantaged households—one of the most diverse and vibrant communities in the country.

In 2024, JA Miami and M-DCPS launched the Partnership for Success initiative to ensure every K-12 student has access to hands-on, practical education about money. Through this collaboration, we are integrating JA's proven programs into classrooms district-wide, prioritizing under-resourced schools and creating a model for scalable public-private partnerships.

This year, we took another bold step forward. Building on the momentum of last year's growth, 2023–2024 became the most successful fundraising year in our organization's 68-year history. **Together, we raised more than \$2 million**—a record that expands our capacity to deliver the experiences Miami's students need most.

That impact was real and measurable:

- Over **38,000 students** participated across nearly **150 schools and community organizations**
- Students received more than **375,000 hours** of hands-on instruction
- **350 corporate and community volunteers** engaged with students, connecting classroom learning with the real world
- JA Miami students advanced to **national-level competitions, earning recognition and distinction among their peers**

Behind these numbers are students whose lives are being reshaped. More than half of Miami-Dade students come from families struggling financially, and for them, JA is more than a program—it is a turning point.

Our curriculum helps young people understand money and how to earn it responsibly, save it intentionally, spend it wisely, and share it thoughtfully.

Just as importantly, JA empowers them to explore career pathways, test entrepreneurial ideas, and build the confidence to see themselves as leaders of tomorrow.

Looking ahead, we are committed to even more ambitious goals. Here's how we will continue building on our progress:

- Continue flagship programs like **JA in a Day** and the **JA Company Program**, while exploring new opportunities such as **JA Finance Park**, a hands-on, experiential learning center
- Expand partnerships with **Miami-Dade County Public Schools, businesses, and community organizations** to reach more classrooms and students than ever before
- Strengthen **capacity and operations** to ensure sustainable growth, more impactful fundraising, and the highest quality learning experiences

All of this progress adds up to a simple truth: when we invest in young people, we invest in a stronger Miami. With JA programs, each student has the opportunity to **Change Their Path, Change Their Life**.

JA PROGRAMS

Our programs bring financial literacy, work readiness, and entrepreneurship to life for students from kindergarten through 12th grade. Each learning experience is hands-on, age-appropriate, and aligned to real-world skills and state and national curriculum standards.

ELEMENTARY (GRADES K-5)

INSPIRE

Develop an interest in financial literacy topics, awareness and grounding in the age-appropriate basics, connect topics to everyday life.



MIDDLE (GRADES 6-8)

PREPARE

Build skills, habits, and competencies that will prepare them for high school. Start thinking about related hobbies and special interests.

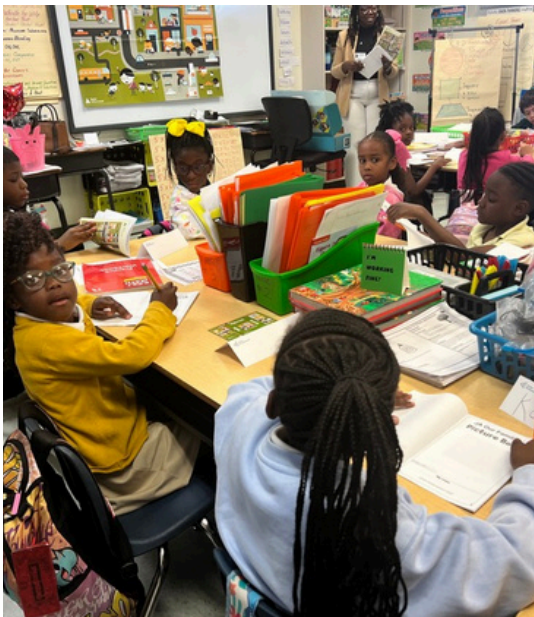
PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS: GRADES K-5

Through fun, hands-on learning experiences, Junior Achievement introduces younger learners to money fundamentals, career ideas, and entrepreneurial concepts.



JA IN A DAY

JA in a Day brings JA's core principles directly into elementary classrooms: students explore earning, saving, budgeting, and giving in just one immersive day. Our partnership with Future Bound Miami (Florida's first Children's Savings Account initiative) connects these lessons to long-term goals—showing students how today's money habits can shape tomorrow's dreams.



FUTURE BOUND MIAMI

Future Bound Miami is the first universal Children's Savings Account (CSA) program in the state of Florida, aiming to improve financial readiness for postsecondary education for students and families in Miami-Dade County Public Schools.

In partnership with Future Bound Miami, JA Miami was a curriculum provider to over 600 classes during the 2024-2025 school year, impacting over 12,400 students!

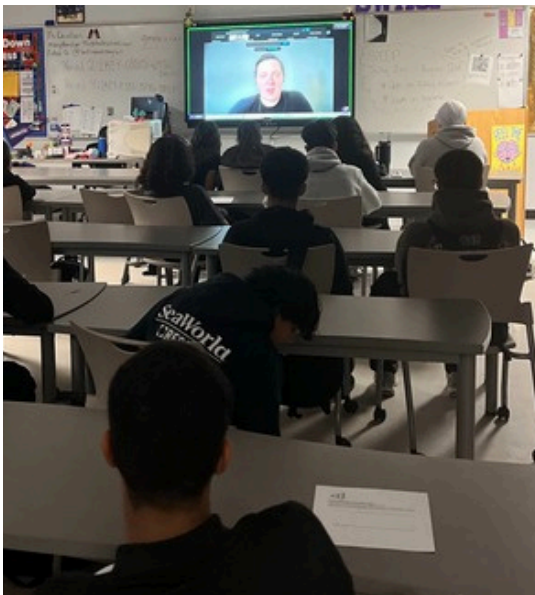
From today's curiosity to tomorrow's career paths, our middle school programs help students explore real-world work environments and career possibilities with confidence.

PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS: GRADES 9-12

Many young people don't understand money—and that lack of knowledge leads to missed opportunities. **We change that.** Through hands-on experiences, mentorship, and real-world applications, our high school students develop the confidence, knowledge, and resilience they need to succeed in life beyond graduation.



JA COMPANY PROGRAM

The JA Company Program gives high school students the opportunity to start and operate their own business from the ground up. Guided by volunteer mentors, students work together to develop a product or service, create a business plan, manage operations, and take them to the market.



JA SMIF

Through the JA Student Managed Investment Fund, students learn the fundamentals of investing by actively managing a real-world investment portfolio. Under the guidance of industry professionals, participants research companies, track market trends, and make informed trade recommendations.



JA JOB SHADOW

JA Job Shadow gives students a behind-the-scenes look at the world of work by connecting them directly with local businesses and professionals. Through workplace tours, hands-on activities, and one-on-one interactions with mentors, students explore career paths, learn about workplace expectations, and discover the skills needed to succeed in today's job market.

STUDENT COMPETITIONS

Our high school competitions give students the opportunity to put their skills into action, apply what they've learned in the classroom, and shine on a larger stage.



JA COMPANY PROGRAM COMPETITION

Each year, JA Miami's young entrepreneurs showcase their student-run businesses at our local JA Company Program Competition, hosted by Miami Dade College. Teams present their products, pitch to judges, and compete for the chance to join the running for the national competition.



JA USA FUTURE BOUND SUMMIT

Top-performing student teams represented JA Miami at the national-level competition, where they went head-to-head with the best young JA student entrepreneurs from across the country. This year, our team Charm Dept (Coral Gables Senior High School) won the ICE Best Financial Performance Award, and My Gym Buddy (Dr. Michael Krop Senior High School) won the Student Choice Award!



JA STOCK MARKET CHALLENGE

The JA Stock Market Challenge brings Wall Street to life through a fast-paced, interactive competition. Students first complete in-class lessons on investing and market strategy, then participate in a county-wide contest that simulates months of trading. Top teams advance to our in-person championship event, a high-energy, real-world market simulation. For 2024, our winning team was Felix Varela Senior High's Jokers Inc!

STUDENT EVENTS

Thanks to our amazing partners, we held several student-focused events this year that were also fundraisers—including a brand new signature event!



JA RISING WOMEN

In May, for the first time, we welcomed 50 middle- and high- school girls who met with 50 mentors from our partner companies. They learned about budgeting, networked with peers, and so much more. A huge thank you to Costex Tractor Part's, Melissa Uribe Gil for being our wonderful event partner and host!



JA STOCK MARKET CHALLENGE

The 9th Annual JA Stock Market Challenge took place in October at Akerman LLP. In the morning, 50 student teams competed in our live-action simulation, then yielded the trading floor to our partners and community to test out their own trading chops.

Congrats to our big winners, the Dividend Dudes at the Jonathan D. + Mark C. Lewis Foundation, who achieved the highest portfolio net worth of the evening, and Akerman's Team 1 with the highest ROI!

The program will culminate in an immersive, hands-on simulation in which students are assigned a career, salary, and life scenario, and must navigate a one-day budget.

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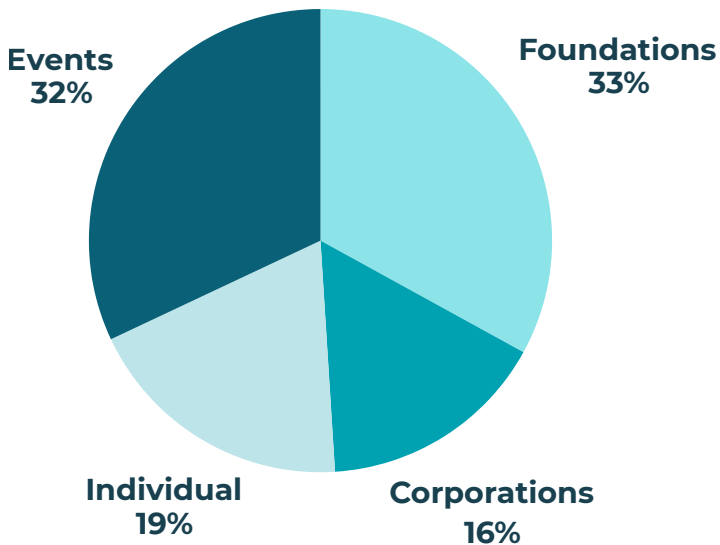
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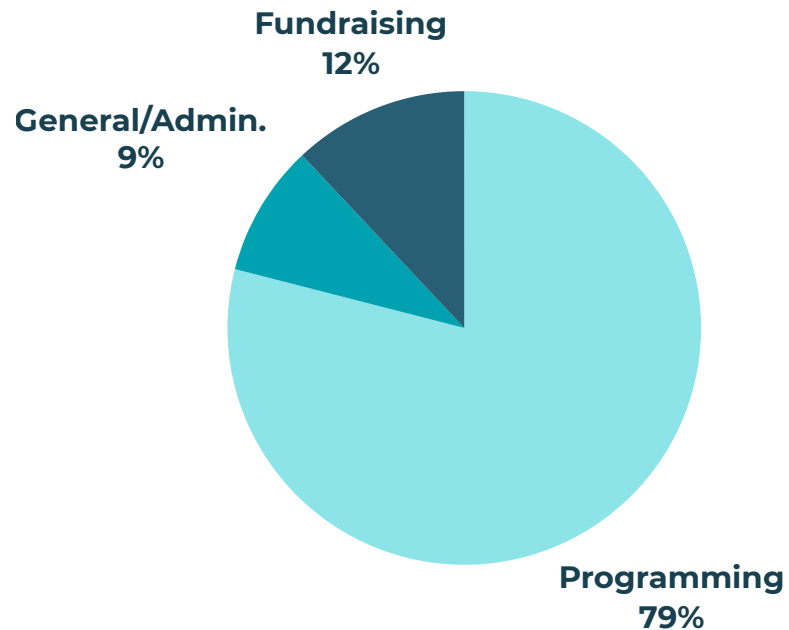
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
