Dear friends of Junior Achievement of Greater Miami,

The past year has been truly transformative for our organization and our community. After a long and successful tenure as president of JA Miami, the wonderful Catherine Haga left the organization in the capable hands of her successor, Lourdes de la Mata Little. We're grateful for all that Catherine did to set us up for the future.

With new leadership comes new approaches. As JA Miami evolves to meet the needs of Miami's next generation of leaders, we embrace the challenge of meeting students where they are—and that's why we're committed to helping students of every income level, going in-depth with each student, and doing this work every day. That's exactly what we've done over the past year.

In 2023-2024, JA Miami changed the lives of **nearly 38,000 students**. Powered by our **353 volunteers**—as well as teachers from our **146 partner schools and community organizations**—we delivered **320,970 impact hours**. And this impact was precisely targeted to help the kids who need it most: **77% of JA Miami students came from low-income households.**

All of these efforts have paid dividends: we're proud to be a leading JA Company Program nationally. We're thrilled to see more schools, volunteers, and students joining this cornerstone entrepreneurship program year-over-year. Our Student-Managed Investment Program remains one of a kind. Speaking of unique to the nation, we launched Partnership for Success, a transformative partnership with the Miami-Dade County Public Schools

that will run through 2027. These successes have been recognized with the Junior Achievement 5-Star Award, and Miami Chamber of Commerce's NOVO Award.

We've also taken strides to celebrate and uplift diverse populations here in Miami, and we're deepening our reach and awareness in underrepresented communities. Lourdes emphasizes the importance of ensuring that every child of every background gets a chance to achieve their fullest potential. This year, **90% of our students came from Hispanic and/or Black backgrounds.**

Moving forward, we plan to build on these incredible successes. Our vision for the future includes:

- Securing multi-year investment commitments which will allow JA Miami to become a self-sustaining legacy institution
- Deepening our footprint to deliver more impact hours for each of our participating students and classes
- Building our core team to provide more engaging events, more impactful fundraising, and more cutting-edge learning experiences

All of this is possible thanks to the dedication and support of people like you, who see the importance of providing young people with the tools to shape their financial futures. On behalf of everyone at JA Miami, thank you for making 2023-2024 our best year yet. And here's to making next year even better!

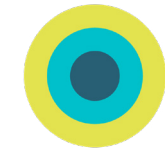

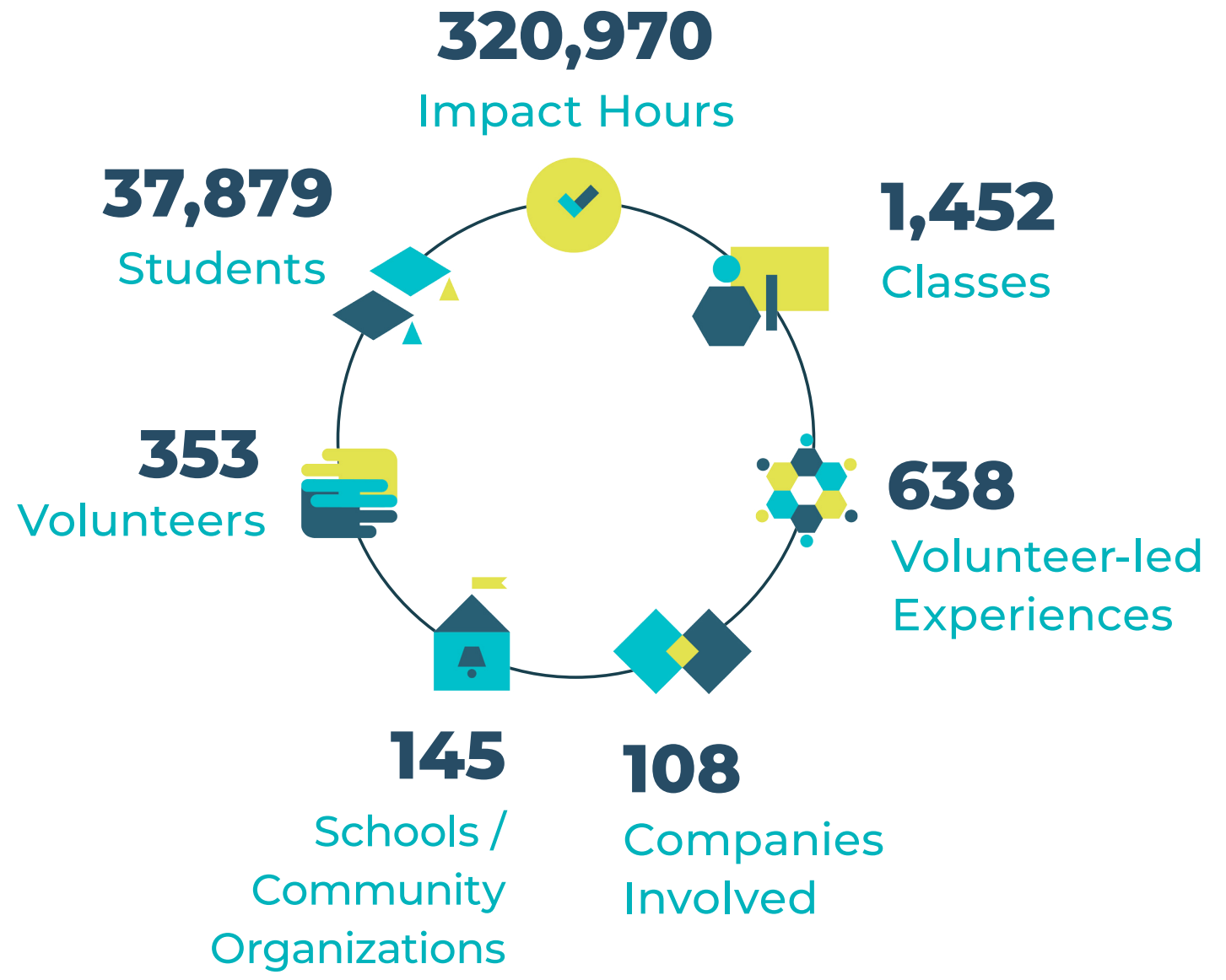

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Inspire Programs



JA IN A DAY

JA in a Day is a one-day immersive experience for elementary and middle school students. We bring out a flood of community volunteers to deliver interactive, age-appropriate lessons across an entire grade level or a whole school! This year, we ran several, including at Ruth K. Broad K-8, David Lawrence K-8, Olinda Elementary, and Brentwood Elementary.



FUTURE BOUND MIAMI

Florida's first universal Children's Savings Account (CSA) program aims to improve financial readiness for postsecondary education for students and families in Miami-Dade County Public Schools. Every kindergarten student in the county is offered a chance to participate in financial literacy lessons, provided by JA Miami, and then to open their own savings account, with gifted money that will grow and be withdrawn upon their graduation.

MIDDLE SCHOOL

Prepare Programs



JA COMPANY PROGRAM® JA COMPANY PROGRAM POP-UP

A middle-school version of our popular program, JA Company Program®, JA Company Program Pop-up teaches students how to plan, launch, and operate their own business venture within a structured, guided experience. Throughout the start-up process, students collaborate, make crucial business decisions, practice communication skills, and develop entrepreneurial knowledge and skills within a streamlined, teacher-led experience. All profits generated benefit the school, a designated community organization, or other school-approved recipients. This year, we ran this program at Sunny Isles Beach K-8 and Frances Tucker K-8.



JA CAREER SPEAKER SERIES®: FOR ALL AGES AND GRADE LEVELS!

In this program, part of our JA Work and Career Readiness Pathway, a volunteer guest speaker shares information about their career, work, and education experience. For the 2023-2024 school year, we began hosting these on Zoom with open registration for all educators, with recorded versions for asynchronous replays. We hosted seven remote events, as well as brought several speakers directly into schools for IRL (in real life) talks.

HIGH SCHOOL

Succeed Programs



JA HIGH SCHOOL HEROES®

JA High School Heroes® is an empowering leadership development opportunity that impacts both high school and elementary students. High school students from Alonzo and Tracy Mourning Senior High School were trained as JA volunteers, and taught classes at David Lawrence K-8, Ruth K. Broad K-8, and Sunny Isles Beach K-8. The high school students gain valuable leadership and mentorship skills, and the elementary students gain amazing role models! Major sponsors of this year's programming included State Farm and the Zollner Foundation.



JA JOB SHADOW®

JA Job Shadow® is a comprehensive experience that helps students design an individualized career path. Supporting blended, as well as self-guided activities, JA Job Shadow provides a design-thinking structure for career exploration. It also includes a workplace site visit and job shadow experience in a career area of interest. This year, we hosted five job shadow days with Delta Airlines, LatAm Airlines, Deloitte, AT&T, Burger King, and Southern Glazer's Wine and Spirits for students at five senior high schools.



JA BE ENTREPRENEURIAL®

JA Be Entrepreneurial® teaches students about the mindset and skills needed for entrepreneurial success. Students learn a problem-solving approach to creating business ideas, and then turn those ideas into concise, effective, actionable one-page business plans. At the culmination, student teams had the opportunity to compete in the Social Innovation Challenge. This year, two teams—Water Warriors from New World School of the Arts and BioBlend from SouthWest Senior High School—both made it to the finals at JA USA’s National Student Leadership Summit in Washington, DC.

THE JA STUDENT-MANAGED INVESTMENT FUND (SMIF)

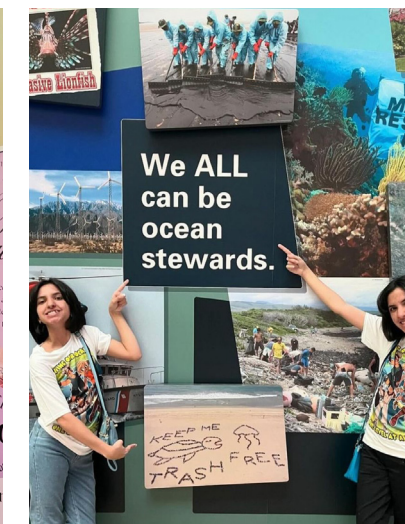
The JA Student-Managed Investment Fund (SMIF) served 76 students in three Miami-Dade County Public Schools, and was sponsored by The Children’s Trust. This program offers students the opportunity to analyze a public company and make investment recommendations. They receive biweekly lessons and guidance from volunteers who work in the investing world over the course of a school semester, and then track their results!

JA COMPANY PROGRAM®

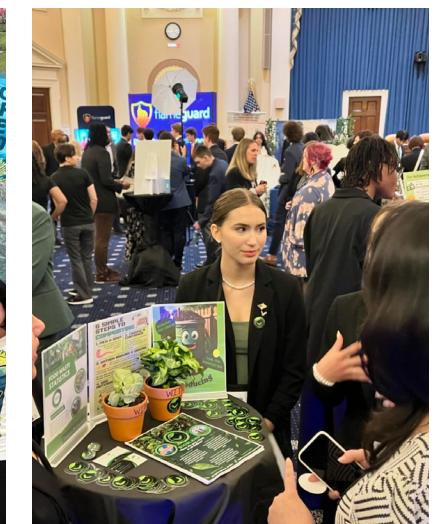
Expanding on our entrepreneurial track, JA Company Program® is a key initiative that teaches high school students how to start and run their own businesses. Through hands-on activities, students create, market, and manage a product or service, learning key entrepreneurial, financial, and leadership skills. Guided by volunteer mentors, the program helps students understand real-world business operations, decision-making, and teamwork. For the 2023–2024 school year, we served 1,513 students creating 54 student companies in 15 schools across Miami-Dade. Students from Alonzo and Tracy Mourning Sr. High School were invited to compete at JA USA’s National Student Leadership Summit. The Templeton Family Foundation and the Soto-Wright Family Foundation were the major sponsors of this year’s programming. **For the 2023–2024 school year, we had three teams make it to the JA National Student Leadership Summit in Washington DC! Coming from the JA Company Program at Alonzo and Tracy Mourning High School, with educator Don Festge, **Vis a Vis** is a student-produced fashion show featuring a diverse array of curated fashion. 200 student designers, models, and crew members took part, and the leadership team sold hundreds of tickets and shirts to support it. They turned a profit on their investment while giving everyone a fantastic show.



Part of the JA Social Innovation Challenge at the New World School of the Arts, **Water Warriors** is an online and app-based video game illustrated and animated by its student creators from Ray Parris’s class about a group of heroes who fight against water polluters. Although they’re off to college this year, the creators hope that it will inspire other students to take action against the detrimental effects of ocean pollution and marine debris.



Finally, **BioBlend Fertilizer** was another top project from the Social Innovation Challenge. From Mary Davidson’s class at Southwest Miami Senior High, this project aims to reduce food waste through school-site composting. You can imagine how much compost is created by even a single school, so the fertilizer created is sold and donated to local urban gardening projects.

STOCK MARKET CHALLENGE



JA STOCK MARKET CHALLENGE

Throughout the month of September, students in participating schools learned the JA Take Stock in Your Future curriculum in their classrooms, learning how the stock market works and how to trade. Then, they tested their investment savviness through a realistic in-class stock market simulation. The top 50 teams went on to compete in person at our action-packed Stock Market Challenge event! Each team had \$1,000,000 and 60 “days” to trade. The team with the highest net worth in its stock portfolio at the closing bell won!

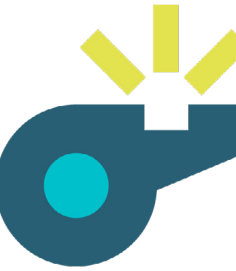
This year, our winners were The ATM Stock Sharks from Alonzo and Tracy Mourning Senior High School.

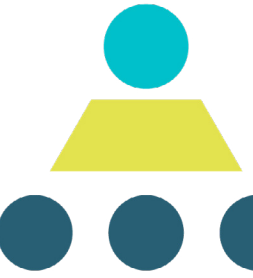
POPULAR BANK'S 7TH ANNUAL BOWL-A-THON

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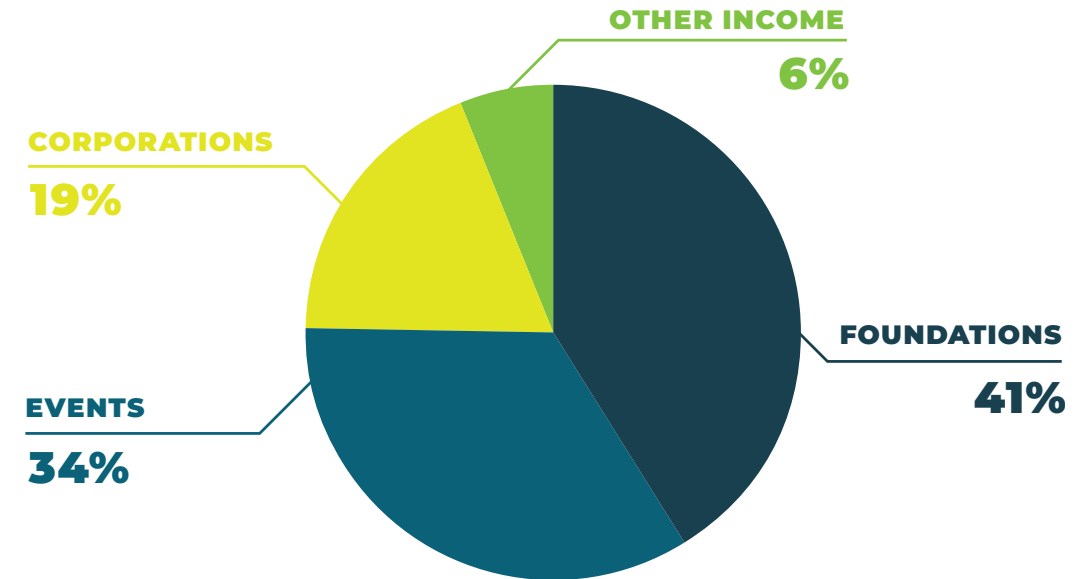
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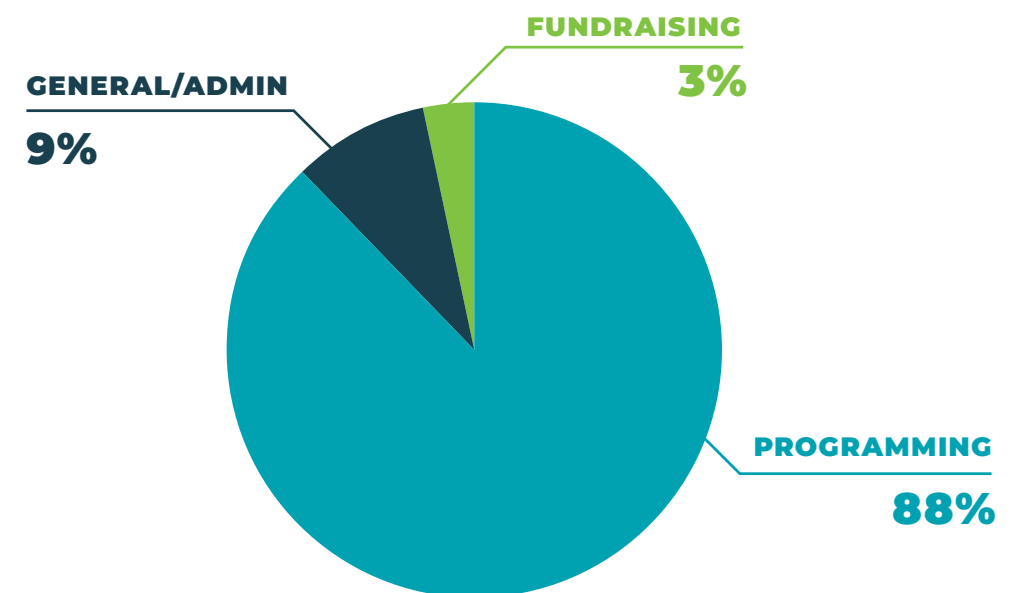


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
